After hearing from our contact on the ground about the lack of food among the Yemeni people, we at Provision International felt the need to help in some tangible way. The main source of food in Yemen are beans and through many faithful local farmers we were able to gather enough to fill a shipping container to be sent to this part of the world.

Upon arriving, the beans were distributed to people in the direst need who not only received some much needed physical food but were also able to hear about the hope which goes way beyond this life. Yemen is 99% Muslim, but we believe there's no place on Earth where Christ's love is not big enough to penetrate the darkness of a human soul and bring forth new life. We do our part and God does the rest. Thank you for partnering with us! Allow us to share two stories with you.

The armed conflict, with its devastating consequences, has left most Yemeni people destitute and unable to afford the most basic necessities of life. Khaled is 45 and one of those most vulnerable war-affected people who were forced to leave their homes and move to other governorates due to the escalation in the conflicts. Khaled and his family live in an IDP (Internally Displaced People) camp that lacks the basic requirements for a decent life. "Because of war, there is no opportunity to work and no income which really affects our ability to get essential things like food, water, and medicine," Khaled explained. "All of life's requirements depend on having income and I do not have any income. The excellent quality of the beans I received will enhance my family's daily meals for the better. I can now say that my children will not be going to bed hungry. Thank you so much!"




Zahra is a widowed mother of five children. After the death of her husband, she was forced to take on the responsibility of raising her children without any help. In order to support them, Zahra spends her entire day cleaning peoples' houses in return for a nominal daily wage.

"Yes, there are food items available to buy in our area, but their high prices make it impossible for me to provide my children with many such essential items. The price of food has doubled since the outbreak of war. The price of just two pounds of beans, for example, is now beyond my ability to afford. The beans I received will really help meet my children's needs."

Before the distribution team left, Zahra went on to thank the team, saying, "I express my thanks and gratitude to God who heard my prayers and guided you to support my family with this kind assistance. My thanks to all the supporters and workers."
